## THE SYNOD A CATHOLIC CHURCH CONVERSATION



Many of us have heard of the expression: “A penny for your thoughts.” This was a popular expression used by my parents and other adults when I was a child growing up in the 1970’s. It was used when a person appeared to be deep in thought or maybe just daydreaming, to inquire about what was on the dreamer’s mind. I believe we can all agree, or at least reach consensus, that there are appropriate times and events in our lives that need input and ideas from others.

Many corporations and institutions seek advice and counsel from their clients and customers to better serve their needs and inquire about the future direction of the institution. The Catholic Church, under the direction of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, is seeking the thoughts and ideas of Catholics regarding the Catholic Church’s mission and ministry in the 21st century.

Considering this, Pope Francis has announced a Universal Synod inviting ALL Catholics across the globe to better discern together how to listen and communicate with each other to strengthen our communion in Christ Jesus. The three components to the Synod on Synodality as outlined by the Pope are “Communion, Participation and Mission.”

*“He descended into Hell, on the third day He rose again.”*

It may sound strange to our ears to confess the fact that Christ, after his death on the cross, and before his Resurrection, descended into Hell. The phrase has alternatively stated that he “descended to the dead.” This is described by Saint Paul in the New Testament: “In saying, ‘He ascended,’ what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.” (Ephesians 4:9-10)

When we say that Christ descended into Hell, we are not saying that he descended to the region of damnation and eternal punishment. Instead, he descended to the place where the righteous men and women who had died, awaited the Redeemer who could open the gates of Heaven for them. In Hebrew, this place was called *Sheol* and in Greek it was known as *Hades*. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Jesus descended to the dead “to free the just who had gone before him.” (CCC 633)

The place where Christ descended to has often been referred to as the Limbo of the Fathers or the Limbo of the Patriarchs. While this column is not the place to discuss the theological concept of “Limbo,” the Limbo of the Fathers was a very real place where those who had died before Christ were waiting for him to open the gates of death and lead them to eternal life in Heaven. The great Patriarchs and figures of the Old Testament (Adam and Eve, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob) would all have been counted among them. Even New Testament figures who had died before Christ (Saint Joseph, Saint John the Baptist) would have been included in this group. Christ’s liberation of these souls is referred to in theology as the “Harrowing of Hell.”

As a sidenote, it is interesting to point out that only those who believed in the God of Israel and awaited the coming of the Messiah were entitled to accompany Jesus into Heaven. For this reason, the great Italian poet Dante Alighieri keeps the incomparable Latin poet Virgil in Limbo. However, as a “virtuous pagan,” Virgil suffers no torment and is free to lead Dante through the circles of Hell in the *Inferno*.

The ultimate sign that Christ has conquered death is the fact of his Resurrection on Easter Sunday. In the Jewish calendar, Sunday was the first day of the week. The seventh day of the Jewish week was Saturday. This was their Sabbath and day of rest. Thus, Easter Sunday has often been associated with the idea of the cosmic “eighth day.” The concept of an eighth day points to the idea of eternity. While history is bound by a seven-day week, an eighth day exists outside of time and lasts forever. Historically, the Catholic Church celebrates an octave after the great Feasts of her calendar (Christmas, Easter, Pentecost). These eight-day celebrations are essentially a continuous celebration of the Church’s great High Feasts.

In the New Testament, Christ states numerous times that the Son of Man will be raised on the third day. As stated last month, this can be an allusion to the three days that Jonah spent in the belly of the whale (Jonah 1:17). It may also recall the three days that it took Mary and Joseph to find the twelve-year old Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:46).

In his teachings, Christ angered the Jews when he stated: “Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up” (John 2:19). Jesus was obviously not speaking of the physical temple in Jerusalem, but he was speaking of himself. Nevertheless, it is interesting to note that within the lifetimes of the first Christians, the Jewish Temple was ultimately destroyed in 70 AD. However, this shouldn’t surprise us when we realize that Christ’s death on the Cross rendered the Jewish Temple worship superfluous, since his death marked the ultimate and final sacrifice to God. This sacrifice continues in eternity through the Eucharist and the reception of Holy Communion. Elsewhere, Christ is more explicit when he told the Apostles: “The Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on third day be raised” (Luke 9:22).

### Reflection for Next Sunday

#### Seventh Sunday of Easter ~ May 29th

First Reading: *Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11*

Second Reading: *Ephesians 1:17-23 or Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23*

Gospel Reading: *Luke 24:46-53*

*Jesus is taken to Heaven and the disciples remain in Jerusalem awaiting His sending of the Spirit.*

### Family Connection

Any family that has tried to sit down to a family dinner or packed the car for a trip has heard children argue at least once about who should sit where. To sit next to someone, especially if that person is important, is to have a place of honor. Jesus has this place of honor, seated now at the right hand of the Father (as we say in the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed), but there's more to this metaphor than where Jesus sits in relation to God. To be in the place of honor is also to be in a place of power. Knowing people in powerful places can be very helpful. Children remind us of this each time we are called upon to referee a conflict. Jesus, honored now at God's right hand, is a powerful ally for us.

As you gather as a family, recall a time when there was a discussion, or perhaps even an argument, about where people were going to sit. Talk about why it might be important to a person to sit in a particular place. Mention that in this Sunday's Gospel we learn about Jesus' place in heaven. Read together Luke 24:46-53. Talk about how in the Creed we describe Jesus' place in heaven as “seated at the right hand of the Father.” Discuss what we might learn about the relationship between God and Jesus from today's Gospel and from the Creed and what we can learn about Jesus' relationship to us. Observe that one of the things we learn is that Jesus continues to help us from this place of honor in heaven. Pray together the Apostles' Creed.
