

Monday January 15 ~ Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Remember to live the Dream as Dr. Martin Luther King preached about. But, we don't do it on our own. We do it with Jesus Christ at our side and in our hearts.

The following is a Reflection From Fr. O'Brien Why Should We Make A Holy Hour?

Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen (1895-1979) was a well-known preacher, writer, and radio/television personality of the 20th Century. Anyone who is familiar

with him will know that he was a man of great faith who had a special love and devotion for the Eucharist. His words can help us to understand not only why we should make a Holy Hour, but how we can make a Holy Hour in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

- 1. "Because it is time spent in the Presence of Our Lord Himself. If faith is alive, no further reason is needed."
- 2. "Because in our busy life it takes considerable time to shake off the 'noonday devils', the worldly cares that cling to our souls like dust." At the beginning of the hour, many thoughts and distractions may flood our minds, but by the end, the cares of the day have hopefully faded into the background as we focus on being in the presence of Christ.
- 3. "Because Our Lord asked for it. 'Had you not strength, then, to watch with Me even for an hour?' (Matthew 26:40). The word was addressed to Peter, but he is referred to as Simon. It is our Simon-nature that needs the hour. If the hours seems hard, it is because 'the spirit is willing enough, but theflesh is weak' (Mk 14:39)."
- 4. "Because the Holy Hour helps us make reparation both for the sins of the world and for our own."
- 5. "Because it will restore our lost spiritual vitality. Our hearts will be where our joys are."
- 6. "Because it reduces our liability to temptation and weakness... Our sinful impulses are prevented from arising through the barrier erected each day by the Holy Hour. Our will becomes disposed to goodness with little conscious effort on our part."
- 7. "Because meditation keeps us from seeking an external escape from our worries and miseries."

Sometimes, stress and worry in our lives can cause us to seek relief in things that are neither spiritually physically good for us. Praying before the Blessed Sacrament is the ultimate good, giving us the grace and assistance that we need to deal with life's trials and difficulties practically.

Reflection for Next Sunday 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time January 21, 2024

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5,10 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Gospel Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

Jesus calls the fishermen, Simon and Andrew, James and John, to be his disciples.

Family Connection

Today's Gospel describes how Jesus called his first disciples and the immediacy with which these men dropped everything to follow him. We can only begin to imagine what Jesus' presence must have been like to invoke such a response in these first disciples. While a few of us might relate to such a radical conversion, many of us would find such a sudden change in ourselves or in another person unsettling. There are few things for which we would willingly drop everything. And yet this is the immediacy with which these first disciples responded to Jesus. These first disciples were willing to drop everything in order to make Jesus and the Kingdom of God the most important things in their lives.

Gather as a family and talk about circumstances in which you have had to "drop everything." (the call to pick up a sick child from school, the cry of a hurt or angry child) How did you feel about having to change your plans in each of these situations? How do we feel when someone asks us to drop everything to help him or her? For many of us, it is not easy to drop everything to respond to the needs of another.

Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:14–20. Invite your family to imagine what Jesus' presence and invitation to these first followers must have been like that they responded by leaving their livelihood to become his disciples. How might our life change if we understood the Kingdom of God to be as important and immediate in our lives? Ask God to help you experience the Kingdom of God with such immediacy. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.





CONFIRMATION PREPARATION PROGRAM:

Monthly Mass sheets will be reviewed to ensure that each reflection (including Christmas) has been received. If any are incomplete Confirmation may be delayed.

Return all your service sheets in as you complete each assignment. Do not hold on to them until the last minute.

EIGHTH GRADE STUDENTS

With the exception of your service hours; all other paperwork should have been submitted to the Religious Education office last Friday. If any forms are outstanding, Confirmation may be delayed.

The sacrament of Confirmation will take place on Wednesday, March 13th at 1:00 PM and 3:30 PM. Bishop Romero will be our presider. Let us welcome him to Our Lady of Lourdes for the first time.

LIFE IS SACRED

If you were born after January 22, 1973, you have never lived in a country where the dignity of the unborn child in the womb was respected and protected. On that day, a decision of the Supreme Court, Roe v Wade, allowed unborn life to be destroyed by abortion. If you were born before that date, the life of the unborn child was respected and protected and the destruction of that life by abortion was unlawful.

On June 24, 2022, Roe v Wade was overturned by the Supreme Court and replaced by Dobbs v Jackson. Abortion is no longer within the jurisdiction of the federal government but is now a decision to be made within the states. The abortion industry is now exerting powerful pressure on states to incorporate abortion into their state constitutions. The struggle continues as does the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. In solidarity with the marchers, January 19 will be a special day of adoration and prayer here at our parish. Please join us.

Respect for all human life, especially the unborn, will be the intention of the 9 a.m. Mass. 
(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select **Rockville Centre-Safe Environment**.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
 - 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

Our students will remain our top priority. We will be working to transition freshmen, sophomores and juniors, as well as those potential new students who were considering Our Lady of Mercy Academy for the 2024-2025 academic year, to new schools. OLMA administration will be meeting with the area Catholic school leaders on Wednesday, January 10, to ensure a smooth application process, including forwarding final academic records at the end of the year.
