THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT MATTHEW 11:2-11



"Rejoice in the Lord always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks always."

(1 Thessalonians 5:16–17)

Today we celebrate the **Third Sunday of Advent**, called **Gaudete Sunday**. The word *Gaudete* means, in Latin, "rejoice." This comes from the antiphon we say at the beginning of Mass from St. Paul: "Rejoice in the Lord always; I say it again, rejoice." (*Philippians 4:4*) Joy is shown by the lighting of the third candle, which is rose in color. The priests may also wear rose-colored vestments, representing joy.

Today, our readings call us to rejoice, or to have joy!

What is joy? Webster's Dictionary defines it as a feeling of happiness, success, or a source of delight. As Christians, joy is more than just a feeling. It is not living in a naïve world where everything is wonderful and perfect. Joy is a state of being at peace, knowing that no matter what is happening in our lives or in the world, we are one with God.

Joy is one of the **Fruits of the Holy Spirit**. St. Paul writes about joy in his Letter to the Galatians (5:22–23). It comes from using the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we receive at Confirmation and when we allow the Spirit's presence to live within us.

St. Paul, in his Letter to the Philippians, writes about joy although he is imprisoned and all seems dark for him. Even though death seems nearly certain, Paul is at peace because he has Christ he has lived his life for Christ and now better things are to come.

Christian joy is independent of all things on earth. Its source is found in the continual presence of Christ. When two lovers are together, they are happy no matter what. We, as Christians, can never lose this joy because, with Christ, we are like two lovers who

remain with one another no matter the circumstances in life. Pope Francis compared Christian joy to a mother in labor who experiences pain during childbirth; however, once the baby is born, the pain is forgotten. When she holds the baby close, she forgets her suffering, and what is left is the "joy of Jesus purified."

He tells us that "Jesus came to bring joy to every age." May we use this time of Advent to live more joyfully—not with frowns on our faces, but with smiles and an attitude of gratitude that shows we are redeemed. Advent tells us to "turn that frown upside down." The more we share our joy with others and show gratitude for this joy, the more we are open to God's presence working through us. My prayer for each of us is that during this Advent we recognize that joy is a fruit we cannot live without. Remember that no matter what, we always have Christ and His Church with us to lead us into the joy of heaven.

May God bless you, and may Mary keep you and your families always.

Reflection for Next Sunday

Fourth Sunday of Advent

December 21, 2025

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14
Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7
Gospel Reading: Matthew 1:18-24

An angel appears to Joseph, directing him to take Mary as his wife and telling him that the child she will bear will be called Emmanuel.

Family Connection

Joseph and Mary are our models for family life and for service of God. Even when the circumstances seemed unclear, Joseph trusted God. Healthy family life is built upon trust, trust in God and trust of one another.

Spend some time talking as a family about the importance of trust in your family life, including the ways in which the children trust the adults in the family as well as the ways in which the adults trust the children. Then read today's Gospel. Talk about Joseph's trust of God and reflect together on how your family trusts in God.

Pray together that your family life will be built on trust, as was the family life of Joseph and Mary. Pray and sing together an Advent song, such as "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."









Principal's Message



This Third Sunday of Advent meets us in the middle of a busy and grace-filled week. We've just celebrated St. Nicholas Day, a reminder

that quiet generosity can change the people around us. We've kept the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which turns our eyes to Mary and her steady yes to God. And today we look at our wreath and see three candles burning: hope, peace, and now the pink candle of joy.

Hope was our starting place. It's the small flame that rises even when the days feel dark. Peace followed, inviting us to slow down and trust that God is already at work in the places we worry about most. Now joy stands before us, not as loud excitement but as a deep confidence that Christ is near. Joy asks us to look for signs of God's presence in the ordinary parts of our lives: a kind word, a shared meal, a moment of rest.

As a school community, we'll also take the next two weeks to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation with students in grades 3 through 8. It's a chance to pause, look honestly at our lives, and let God's mercy meet us. Our second graders will keep preparing for their first Reconciliation in January, learning what it means to say sorry, to forgive, and to begin again.

We see all this light reflected in the people around us: our students who bring energy and curiosity, our faculty and staff who guide with patience, our parents who support with love, and our alumni who carry our mission forward. Their examples remind us that the Advent light isn't only on the wreath. It's alive in our community.

As we move closer to Christmas, we're invited to carry all three candles within us. Hope that lifts our eyes forward. Peace that steadies our hearts. Joy that reminds us we're not alone. May this week help us notice the light that's growing, both around us and in us, as we wait for the coming of the Lord.

Abp. for the Military, Timothy Broglio, says Catholic Chaplains Hindered by Army Cancellation of Religious Support Contracts

In a move that Archbishop for the Military Services, USA, Timothy Broglio says is "injurious to the practice of the Catholic faith on Army installations," the U.S. Army Installation Management Command has cancelled all religious support contracts for Army chapels, including those for Religious Education coordinators, Catholic Pastoral Life coordinators, and musicians.

These services are vital to Catholic chaplains, given the extreme under-representation of Catholics in Army chaplaincy services, Archbishop Broglio explained in a pastoral letter sent to members of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, and also to every member of Congress. While "about twenty percent of soldiers are Catholic," he notes, "less than 5.5% of the Chaplain Corps is Catholic."

"There are about six Protestant chaplains for every 1,000 Protestant soldiers, "per a RAND report cited by Archbishop Broglio, but only "one Catholic chaplain for every 1,000 Catholic soldiers." Catholic chaplains serve six times as many soldiers as their Protestant counterparts.

"Moreover," the archbishop writes, with "Catholic chaplains most often assigned full-time to operational units, such as brigades and battalions," the demands and "operational tempo" of those units "make it impossible for a Catholic chaplain to oversee the daily operations of chapel programs without professional support."

The U.S. Army's cancellation of religious support contracts, cuts off the Catholic chaplains' vital professional support. This "over-burdens Catholic chaplains," writes Archbishop Broglio. It has a "negative impact" on "Catholic soldiers serving in the U.S. Army and their families." And it "impedes the constitutional guarantee of the free exercise of religion, especially for Catholics."

Please write to your Congressional representatives, in the House and Senate, referencing the letter they received from Archbishop Broglio, and urging them to reverse this unjust mandate that unduly burdens Catholic chaplaincy services in the U.S. Army.






