THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION DECEMBER 8

I invite you to join us for Mass on the Holy Day of Obligation celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. This title is given to Mary, our Mother, the Mother of God. The Blessed Mother, under the title of the Immaculate Conception, has been the Patroness of the United States since 1846.



The United States Catholic Catechism for Adults explains: "No sin would touch her, so that she would be a fitting and worthy vessel of the Son of God. The Immaculate Conception does not refer to the virginal conception and birth of Christ, but rather to Mary's being conceived without inheriting Original Sin." (USCCA, pp. 142–143)

When we speak of the Immaculate Conception, we mean that singular privilege granted to no other human being: that Our Lady was preserved from Original Sin from the very first moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne.

In his Apostolic Constitution on the Immaculate Conception (December 8, 1854), Blessed Pope Pius IX solemnly declared:


"We declare, pronounce, and define that the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, at the first instant of her conception, was preserved immaculate from all stain of original sin by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, in virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of humankind. This doctrine was revealed by God and therefore must be firmly and constantly believed by all the faithful."

This teaching on the Immaculate Conception was defined infallibly by Pope Pius IX, meaning it is taught without error in matters of faith and morals. In making this pronouncement, the Pope spoke ex cathedra, or "from the chair," exercising his universal authority as the Church's supreme teacher. The only other ex cathedra pronouncement is the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Mother, defined by Pope Pius XII.

Mass Times: Monday December 8: 6:45 am, 9:00 am, 12:10 pm, 7:30 pm. Since the Immaculate Conception falls on a Monday next to Sunday, the 5:00pm Mass on Sunday counts for Sunday only. It is NOT a Vigil Mass for the Immaculate Conception.

BLESSING OF BABY JESUS DECEMBER 13 - 14 BAMBINELLI SUNDAY

On the Third Sunday of Advent St. John Paul II invited the families of Rome to bring their Baby Jesus Figures from their home nativity sets for a special blessing. This is called Bambinelli (Baby Jesus) Sunday. Pope John Paul II began this tradition to



remind families about the joyous event of Baby Jesus' arrival in the manger.

We invite you to bring your Baby figures from your Nativity Scenes at home for this blessing on December 13 & 14. Children are especially invited to bring the Baby Jesus figure to the 9:00am Family Mass on December 14.

ADVENT 2 PEACE

On this Second Sunday of Advent, the Prophet St. John the Baptist calls us to repent and make a highway for God. He challenges us to remove and turn away from the idols of power, money, comfort, self-reliance, the desire to be noticed, distraction or anything that we might place where only God should stand. What do I need to do this week to make room for God in my heart and in my life so that Christ can be born in me? Only this can bring us peace. May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always.

Reflection: POPE ST. DAMASUS gave his love & fiat to God and His Church

Saint Damasus was born in Rome at the beginning of the fourth century. His father, a widower, had received Holy Orders there and served as parish priest in the church of St. Laurence.

Damasus was archdeacon of the Roman Church in 355 when the Pope, Saint Liberius, was banished to Berda. Damases followed him into exile, but afterwards returned to Rome. On the death of Saint Liberius in 366, our Saint was chosen to succeed him, at the age of sixty-two. A certain Ursinus, jealous of his election and desiring for himself that high office, had himself proclaimed pope by his followers, inciting a revolt against Damasus in Rome, in which 137 people died. The holy Pope did not choose to resort to armed defense, but the Emperor Valentinian, to defend him, drove the usurper from Rome for a time. Later he returned, and finding accomplices for his evil intentions, accused the holy Pontiff of adultery. Saint Damasus took only such action as was becoming to the common father of the faithful. He assembled a synod of forty-four bishops, in which he justified himself so well that the calumniators were excommunicated and banished.

Having freed the Church of this new schism, Saint Damasus turned his attention to the extirpation of Arianism in the West and of Apollinarianism in the East, and for this purpose convened several councils. He sent Saint Zenobius, later bishop of Florence, to Constantinople in 381 to console the faithful, cruelly persecuted by the Emperor Valens. He commanded Saint Jerome to prepare a correct Latin version of the Bible, since known as the Vulgate, and he ordered the Psalms to be sung accordingly. He rebuilt and adorned the Church of Saint Laurence, still called Saint Laurence in Damaso. He caused all the springs of the Vatican to be drained, which were inundating the tombs of the holy persons buried there, and he decorated the sepulchers of a great number of martyrs in the cemeteries, adorning them with epitaphs in verse.

Saint Damasus is praised by Theodoret as head of the famous doctors of divine grace of the Latin church. The General Council of Chalcedon calls him the "honor and glory of Rome." Having reigned for eighteen years and two months, he died on December 10, 384, when he was nearly eighty years old. In the eighth century, his relics were definitively placed in the church of Saint Laurence in Damaso, except for his head, which was conserved in the Basilica of Saint Peter. He presided over the Council of Rome of 382 that determined the canon or official list of Sacred Scripture.

Throughout his papacy, St. Damasus spoke out against major heresies in the church and encouraged production of the Vulgate Bible with his support for St. Jerome. He helped reconcile the relations between the Church of Rome and the Church of Antioch, and encouraged the veneration of martyrs.



Principal's Message



Last week our Young Church traveled to the National Catholic Youth Conference in Indianapolis, and I had the privilege of going as a chaperone.

The experience was a powerful reminder of the faith, energy, and hope alive in our young people.

Throughout the conference, the witness talks from teens across the country set an inspiring tone. Their honesty about faith, struggle, and God's grace encouraged our own teens to reflect more deeply. Sister Elfie, a Salesian Sister and one of the dynamic MCs, kept the crowd engaged with her joy and authenticity. Our group was especially moved when we saw Tess Austin with the Salesian Sisters. Knowing her journey toward her vocation made that moment personal for us and a strong example of trust in God's call.

On Friday at Lucas Oil Stadium, our teens experienced something truly historic. Bishop Joe from New York and Pope Leo XIV spoke directly to the young Church during a digital encounter. Five teenagers were invited to ask the Holy Father questions about using technology wisely, recovering from mistakes, giving worries to Jesus, avoiding distractions, and preparing for the future of the Church. Pope Leo offered practical and encouraging guidance that spoke not only to the youth gathered before him, but to the entire Church. His message reminded them to keep Christ at the center of their lives and to trust that God works through both their strengths and their uncertainties.

Prayer shaped each day of NCYC, but nothing compared to Adoration. Seventeen thousand young people fell to their knees in complete silence before the Blessed Sacrament. It was a moment of grace that touched every heart in the stadium. The powerful music throughout the conference lifted spirits and created moments of reflection that helped our teens connect more deeply with God.

Our group returned home renewed and strengthened in their faith. As a chaperone, I am grateful for the chance to walk with them, to witness their prayer, and to see God at work in their lives. NCYC reminded us that the young Church is alive, sincere, and eager to grow. Our parish is blessed to have such faithful and open-hearted young people.

A sincere thank you to all who supported our youth and helped make this journey possible. Your encouragement, prayers, and generosity carried them to this dynamic conference and allowed them to encounter Christ in a lifechanging way. We are grateful for every person who invested in their faith and believed in the importance of this experience.

Family Connection

It is easy to look at our world and become discouraged by the apparent absence of God and signs of God's salvation. Advent, however, is a season of hope, in which we acknowledge that salvation is both mysteriously present, even in our world, and yet to be fulfilled.

Read together today's Gospel. Think about John's question to Jesus: Are you the One? Jesus does not answer directly, but points to the signs of the kingdom present in his midst.

Together as a family, look through the newspaper for signs of hope that God is at work in our world. Pray that the world will know God's salvation by praying together the Lord's Prayer.

All parishioners are invited to volunteer to be a part of the offertory procession at the Mass which you attend. This may be especially appropriate if the Mass is being offered for a relative or friend. Please see one of the Ushers before Mass begins to make your intention known.

Religious Freedom Upholds Celebrating Christmas

As Advent begins, so will the annual controversy over Christmas displays and activities. So here is a brief summary of the Rutherford Institute's "Twelve Rules of Christmas." http://bit.ly/1TNKSQb

Public schools must allow students' personal expressions of the religious significance of Christmas unless they cause substantial disruption. Students may distribute literature about Christmas or invitations to church Christmas events consistent with rules governing student distribution of materials unrelated to schoolwork.

Teachers, if generally permitted to express their views about the holidays through personal items and attire, must not have Christmas-related expression prohibited. Teachers may send Christmas cards to families of students, as long as they do it on their own time.

Public schools may teach students about Christmas, including its religious significance, as long as it is for secular purposes, i.e., historical or cultural importance, not to promote Christianity. While they may not require students to sing Christmas songs whose messages conflict with their beliefs, they may include religiously themed Christmas music in their choral programs for secular purposes, i.e., musical quality or cultural value, or as part of an overall performance that includes songs relating to Chanukah, Kwanzaa, or other similar holidays.

Private citizens or groups may erect creches or other Christmas displays in public parks, subject to the same restrictions as other similar displays.

Government entities may erect Christmas displays, including creches, in context with other symbols of the holiday season, displayed to celebrate the public Christmas holiday, not promote its religious content.

Neither public nor private employers may prevent employees from decorating their offices for Christmas, playing Christmas music, or wearing Christmas-themed clothing because of the religious content, as long as such expressions are not used to harass or intimidate others. Employees whose sincerely held religious beliefs require that they not work on Christmas must be reasonably accommodated, barring undue hardship on the employer.

Government recognition of Christmas as a public holiday, and a paid holiday for government employees, does not violate the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment.

Inside every home, in every front yard, inside and outside our churches and throughout community spaces, may the birth of the Infant Jesus be honored and celebrated...

- We are never alone in our pain.


When I get home from NCYC...




