THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT MATTHEW 24:37-44



HAPPY ADVENT! HAPPY NEW CHURCH YEAR!

If there is one season in the Church year that tends to get overlooked, it is Advent. More and more, it feels like we jump straight from Halloween into Christmas. While there is certainly excitement about the holidays and the desire to support the economy, we must not forget the true purpose of this season that prepares our hearts for the coming of Christ. If we don't enter Advent intentionally, we risk missing the many graces God wants to give us.

Advent marks the beginning of the new Church Year—so Happy New Year! This year, we will focus on the Gospel of Matthew as we move into Liturgical Year A, journeying with Jesus through His teachings, His parables, and His call to true discipleship.

The word Advent comes from the Latin Adventus, meaning "coming." During this sacred season, the Church invites us to reflect on the three comings of Christ:

- 1. Christ's Second Coming from the First Sunday of Advent until December 16 Jesus coming again in glory.
- 2. Christ's Coming in History December 17–24 The Lord who took on human flesh and was born in Bethlehem.
- 3. Christ's Coming in Our Lives Daily Jesus present with us every day—if we are open to Him.

The reflection on the Second Coming reminds us that Christ is no longer the "sweet little Jesus" of the manger but the Risen Lord who will come again to judge the living and the dead. As the Scouts BSA say, "Be Prepared!" The Old Testament readings throughout Advent highlight hope, renewal, and transformation through the voices of the prophets.

There is a story about St. Philip Neri playing pool with a group of young people. One of them asked, "What would you do if Jesus arrived right now?" St. Philip answered, "I would finish the game of pool." His lesson was simple: Christians should live every moment ready for the Lord's coming—so ready that nothing needs to be changed or rushed if He appeared at this very moment.

As we begin this season of preparation, here is a powerful Advent reflection to guide us:

"Advent is the perfect time to clear and prepare the Way. By reflection and prayer, by reading and meditation, we can make our hearts a place where the blessing of peace desires to abide and where the birth of the Prince of Peace might take place. Daily, we can make an Advent examination. Are there feelings of prejudice or resentment hidden within us? Is there an unforgiven injury lingering in our hearts? Do we look down on others because of their status or abilities? Are we generous with the gifts entrusted to us, seeing ourselves as stewards and not owners? Are we reverent toward others, their ideas, their needs, and all of creation? These become Advent lights by which we search the deep corners of our hearts. May this Advent season bring hope, transformation, and fulfillment into the Advent of our lives." — Edward Hays, A Pilgrim's Almanac







Reflection for Next Sunday

Second Sunday of Advent

December 7, 2025


First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10 Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9 Gospel Reading: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptist appears in Judea preaching a message of repentance.

Family Connection

We do many things to get ourselves ready for our celebration of Christmas: purchase gifts, prepare Christmas cards, decorate our homes. John's call of repentance in preparation for Jesus reminds us that our repentance is another way in which we can prepare for the Lord's coming and our celebration of Christmas. Parish communities often offer a communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Advent season. Your family might choose to participate in the communal celebration of the sacrament, or you might seek out the sacrament on an individual basis.

Read together today's Gospel. Talk about how John reminds the people that they prepare for the reign of God by reforming their lives. As a family, prepare a simple reconciliation service in preparation for Christmas such as the following: Gather in a prayerful space, perhaps around your family Advent wreath. Read again today's Gospel: Matthew 3:1-3. Invite each family member to pray silently, asking God to forgive their sins. Pray together an Act of Contrition. Then celebrate God's forgiveness by sharing a Sign of Peace with each other.

The image of our Lady of Guadalupe has great symbolism. Our Blessed Mother's image surrounded by luminous light, standing on the moon, and with stars on her mantle reflects the description found in the Book of Revelation: "A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars" (12:1).

Mary does not claim to be God, but only His messenger and loving mother. The stars on her mantle indicate that she comes from Heaven, as Queen and loving Mother. Blessed Mother's standing on indicates divine triumph over evil. The high placement of the bow and the apparent swelling of the abdomen of the Blessed Mother conclude that Mary is pregnant. The crescent moon under our Lady's feet also symbolizes perpetual virginity and is connected with her Immaculate Conception and Assumption.

Ashamed of the Gospel?

At the 2014 National Catholic Prayer Breakfast in Washington, D.C., Prof. Robert P. George, McCormick Professor of Jurisprudence and Director of the James Madison Program in American Ideals and Institutions at Princeton University, stated that, in America, the days of acceptable Christianity and comfortable Catholicism are over. Prof. George began by asking the attendees if they were ashamed of the Gospel.

Prof. George explained that in America the days of being a comfortable Christian or an acceptable Catholic have been ruthlessly ended by the changes in our culture. He was reflecting on how our 1st amendment religious freedom has been reshaped to a shadow of its intent and no longer protects an outward support of conscientiously held beliefs about matters such as traditional marriage, gender classification, sexual morality and the sacredness of life at all stages.

Though these Gospel truths are clearly taught and upheld by the Catholic church they are no longer politically correct in our general culture and bring censure and condemnation of those who will state those beliefs...those who are not ashamed to speak and espouse the teachings of the Bible. Christians and Catholics are told they must adhere to the cultural redefinition of good and evil...or else!

Biblical and natural law beliefs about morality were once a pillar of our culture, but are now the cause of derision, labeling, discrimination and even outright persecution.

Pro-life advocates outside abortion clinics have been arrested and even imprisoned.

Bakers, florists and photographers have lost their businesses over lawsuits denying their conscience rights to refuse creatively messaging against their faith.

The owners of Hobby Lobby and the Little Sisters of the Poor had no choice but to appeal to the Supreme Court to exempt them from providing abortion inducing drugs, contraception and sterilization through their healthcare plans.

Traditional Latin Mass attendees, their choir directors and pastors were labeled by the FBI as potential terrorists and subjected to defamation and government spying.




