#### THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO First Sunday of Lent Matthew 4:1-11 Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18—Ash Wednesday

#### LENT-WHAT IS IT REALLY ABOUT???

During my time at King's College '91 in Wilkes-Barre PA, I often thought of Lent as drudgery and just another time to get through so that we can eat our candy and all the goodies at Easter. However, as time passed, I saw Lent through different eyes. It is not just because I am an ordained priest, but also because I grew more aware of what it means to be a Baptized Christian and a follower of Jesus Christ.

Lent does not have to be a drag for us. It can be a time of joy. In the church's liturgy, the first preface of Lent says "for by your gracious gift each year your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure...that they are led to a fullness of grace".

The word Lent means Spring. These next 7 weeks are meant to be a gift to us to help us spring into Easter. During the season of Spring in the northern hemisphere, we often do spring cleaning in our homes, basements, cabins and summer cottages to clean out the old and the dusty and bring in the new. How appropriate during this season of Lent, that not only do we focus on the externals of life but also to focus within. I look at Lent as a great 40-day Retreat where we can really see where we have distanced ourselves away from the Lord and what has been keeping us from embracing his loving presence.

In the Gospel of Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 that we heard on Ash Wednesday, Jesus speaks about three ways that we can clean the inner home of our hearts: prayer, fasting and almsgiving- (works of love). He is challenging us to think about the sincerity of our prayers. The prayer we are called to this Lent is not only through wrote prayer, formulas and even liturgy but also prayer that comes from the heart.

Often we say prayers like the Our Father, Hail Mary or the Creed without giving it much thought. Lent calls us to pray from the heart. This reflects on our relationship with a loving God. Prayer from the heart flows from belonging to and being held by a Father who loves us beyond all measure. Instead of **always talking in prayer** I always try to **listen in prayer**. One scriptural passage from the Book of Samuel 3:7-11 to help is to say in our prayer: "speak Lord your servant is listening". Listen and see what God has in store for you.


The second tool Jesus gives us to use during Lent is fasting. When we think of fasting, we always hear the question, "what are you giving up for Lent?" We often think about giving up things such as candy, soda, chips, alcohol, etc. We fast out of habit without thinking. One question to ask is, how will my fast help me to open my heart more to Jesus and others? Maybe it is not so much food or things that you are to give up but emotions and attitudes that have led to a sinful life like anger, self-concern, guilt, suspicion, lust and laziness. Maybe it is fasting from an addiction like drinking or pornography. Whatever it is, unite it with the Passion of Christ on the cross and in union with all your brothers and sisters who are also fasting because they are poor. They recognize that they need more of God in their lives. True fasting will make that happen.

Finally we hear about almsgiving or works of love. This will help us to clear out the junk of selfishness that often invades our hearts. My first pastor Fr. Frank Gaeta often said that "works of mercy and love are the fruit of holiness." Perhaps there is a neighbor, soup kitchen, a sick person or a lonely person that needs your presence this Lent. During my sophomore year at King's College, I remember that we went on a mission of mercy under the direction of Campus Ministry. We were involved with Habitat for Humanity in Knoxville, TN. It was here that we discovered poverty on our own soil. We helped build homes, tear down walls and feed the hungry. I found Jesus in so many people who, though vulnerable and poor, were so thankful to us who helped them. I think we got more from them than they from us because they showed us that love, sacrifice, and caring are what makes life real.

Jesus calls you now into the desert to journey with him this Lent and renew the covenant of love. He wants you to fall in love with him again so that you will experience the love he gave each of us from the cross. May we make this period of Lent a time of joy and renewal and not one of hardship and drudgery. Remember that the joy that comes from a clean house will be a hundredfold greater with a clean heart and soul.

God has always been faithful and now he calls us back to that same faithfulness. This is the time to heed God's call, follow Him into the desert and allow Him to love us until we are fully a part of his house forever. May God bless you and your families always. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!



#### Reflection for Next Sunday 2nd Sunday of Lent March 5, 2023

First Reading: *Genesis* 12:1-4a Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:8b-10 Gospel Reading: Matthew 17:1-9 Jesus is transfigured on the mountain in the presence of Peter, James, and John.

#### **Family Connection**

For the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert to his Transfiguration. Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration.

The story of Jesus' Transfiguration is told in the three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In each of those Gospels, the Transfiguration follows Jesus' first prediction of his death and his teaching about the costs of discipleship. Jesus' Transfiguration is a promise of Jesus' glory, his Resurrection.

On a mountain in today's reading, a voice affirms that Jesus is God's Son in words reminiscent of the voice at Jesus' baptism. In addition, the appearance of Moses and Elijah on the mountain connects this story with God's relationship to the people of Israel. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, respectively. Together with Jesus, they represent God's complete Word.

The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John. In Matthew's Gospel, those disciples are among the first whom Jesus calls. The three men are identified as an "inner circle" among Jesus' disciples when Jesus asks them to accompany him to the Garden of Gethsemane just before his arrest.

The Real Presence of Christ is the gift He gave us at the Last Supper, and when we come to church, we are truly in the presence of our God, our Creator and our Redeemer. On the First Friday of each month, we gather before our Eucharistic Lord to pray that the culture of life will prevail over the culture of death, that respect for all human life from conception to natural death will be restored in the hearts and minds of all God's Children Please join us for a Holy Hour of prayer before Jesus in the Eucharist on the First Friday of each month from 8:00 pm to 9:00 pm. It may be a sacrifice to set aside this time, but time spent in the presence of the Lord is its own reward.

## Nocturnal Adoration

Lent began this past Wednesday. As a sacrifice for Lent we invite you to come to Nocturnal Adoration this coming Friday. Ask Jesus to help you live this time of Lent to get closer to Him. Everyone is welcome. We pray during this time for our own intentions and for our parish and our country.

Jesus is always there. Will you come and spend time with him?

The next hour of Adoration will be this coming Friday, March 3rd from 9 to 10 PM.

## Liturgy and Music



The season of Lent is a time to retreat and reflect where we make a conscious shift in the tone in how we bring about the music at our liturgies. We are called to allow times of sacred silence during our liturgical prayer. That silence when it is not our norm can be uncomfortable. But it is in those grace filled quiet moments that God spirit speaks to us. In our liturgy we are given times that we can make that silence happen. Before Mass begins, during the penitential act, after each Scripture reading, after the homily, and after Communion. This Lent allow God to speak to you in the stillness and silence. Be still and present to God's movement in the silence.


