

## THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER JOHN 17:1-11A

#### MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY

Last Friday May 12th our 2nd Grade First Holy Communicants from our Parish School crowned the Blessed Mother. On Sunday May 21st the First Holy Communicants and other children from the Parish will crown the Blessed Mother. May is the Month of Mary.

For centuries, the Catholic Church has emphasized the month of May as a time of honor and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parishes and families often celebrate with special pilgrimages, devotions, or placing a crown on a statue of Mary, traditionally called a "May Crowning."

On April 29, 1965, Pope Blessed Paul VI promulgated his encyclical Mense Maio ("The Month of May"), which promoted May devotions to the Blessed Mother, knowing that, "the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise" (n. 2). Despite being a lesser-known encyclical, its timing and topic are revealing. Released on the eve of the last session of the Second Vatican Council and amid escalating violence and unrest of the Vietnam War and the 1960's, the help of Mary was "a matter of top priority" considering "the present needs of the Church and the status of world peace" (n. 3). The words of Paul VI are just as relevant today. In our contentious social and political climate, focusing on Mary is not a pious distraction from real issues, but a vital source for grace, truth, and mercy.

#### WHO IS MARY, THE BLESSED MOTHER?

Here is a little catechesis for parents and for all of us of what we should know about Marty. What should a child know about Mary?

#### 1. Mary was a real person.

With all the fictional characters that we present to kids, it is important that they know Mary really lived here on earth. Talk about who Mary's parents were (Joachim and Anne) and what Mary's life as a child might have been like.

#### 2. Mary never sinned.

Because Mary had a special calling from God, she never did anything that would offend or hurt God. She was full of grace and virtue.

#### 3. Mary is the mother of Jesus.

Mary was an important part of God's plan to bring Jesus, Our Savior, into the world. She loved and cared for Jesus from the time He was a baby to the time He went back to Heaven.

#### 4. Mary is our Heavenly Mother.

Mary has a special job to care for us and protect us. She wants all of God's children to be with her in heaven one day.

#### 5. Mary wants us to talk to her.

When we pray the Hail Mary or a rosary, we "talk" to Mary. She loves it when children come to her in prayer. Ask her to help you become more like Jesus.

Teaching our children and others that they can come to Jesus thru Mary is one of the greatest gifts we can ever give.

Cluster of bugle blue eggs thin Forms and warms the life within; And bird and blossom swell In sod or sheath or shell.

All things rising, all things sizing Mary sees, sympathizing With that world of good Nature's motherhood.

Their magnifying of each its kind With delight calls to mind How she did in her stored Magnify the Lord.

Well but there was more than this: Spring's universal bliss Much, had much to say To offering Mary May.

When drop-of-blood-and-foam-dapple Bloom lights the orchard-apple And thicket and thorp are merry With silver-surfèd cherry

And azuring-over greybell makes Wood banks and brakes wash wet like lakes And magic cuckoocall Caps, clears, and clinches all—

This ecstasy all through mothering earth Tells Mary her mirth till Christ's birth To remember and exultation In God who was her salvation.

#### Reflection for Next Sunday Pentecost Sunday May 28, 2023

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:11
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13
Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23

#### **Family Connection**

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation.

As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting everyone to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or an issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting on how your family might address it. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:19-23. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's Psalm or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another a Sign of Peace.

#### **NEWS FROM ALBANY**

With the passage of the New York State budget, our tax money will be paying for the free distribution of abortion pills on the SUNY and CUNY campuses. Another piece of legislation under consideration in Albany is "Medical Aid in Dying", a euphemism for assisted suicide. The details of the bill demand our strong opposition. 



# in Oklahoma Threatened with Expulsion from Medicare, Medicaid and CHIP Over Its Long-Approved Sanctuary Candle?

The government has seen the light and has abandoned its attempt to force an Oklahoma hospital to blow out a small candle or stop serving elderly, disabled, and low-income patients," Lori Windham, vice president and senior counsel at the Becket religious liberty legal group, said May 5 on Twitter.

The chapel's candle has never been an issue in previous inspections. Other open flames are permitted at hospitals in kitchen stoves and ovens, gas dryers in the laundry room, flames in gas water heaters, and welding for construction purposes, Windham noted.

According to Windham, the hospital candle is "encased in a thick glass globe, which is itself encased in a second glass globe, covered by a bronze top that fits over the second globe." This globe rests in a bronze holder affixed to the chapel wall. There are fire extinguishing sprinkler heads around the candle and the local fire marshal has long approved it.

During a Feb. 21 inspection, Windham's letter to CMS recounted, a surveyor from The Joint Commission at Saint Francis Hospital South in Tulsa "expressly asked to go to the chapel to see if there was a living flame." The surveyor observed to hospital personnel that Catholic hospitals had complied extinguished the living flame at their chapels, substituting it with an electric light." While federal standards do classify chapel candles as "flameproducing equipment," these are only barred within one foot of a nasal cannula, a device to provide supplemental oxygen. The hospital candle is never near such a device. The relevant codes and standards of the National Fire Protection Association expressly permit sanctuary candles.
