BLESSED ARE THE PEACEMAKERS

One of the best ways to know, love, and live the life of Jesus is by reading what might be called his “autobiography.” In a very real sense, the Beatitudes are Jesus’ autobiography.

The Beatitudes we hear today are part of Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount, one of five great discourses he gives to the people. As he teaches from the mountain, Jesus stands before them as the new Moses—just as Moses once gave the Ten Commandments to the people of Israel. Yet Jesus does more than repeat the law. Through the Beatitudes, he fulfills and deepens the commandments, inviting us into a transformed way of living.

The Beatitudes lead us into a deeper intimacy with Christ and with every person we encounter in life. They are not commandments in the strict sense. They are not simply rules to be followed, but deep interior attitudes of the heart and mind. We may never live them perfectly, yet they remain the pathway to heaven. Their observance is only possible through a deep and abiding love for God and for others.

There is no room for complacency. We may follow the Beatitudes one day and fail the next, but they are always there—calling us forward, shaping us, and leading us toward our ultimate goal of eternal life in heaven.

One Beatitude worthy of special reflection today is: “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.” Peacemakers are those who build relationships of reconciliation and unity. They strive to bring people together—to understand differences, to listen without immediately responding, and to learn from one another—in order to help build the Kingdom of God here on earth.

The peace that peacemakers seek is not merely the absence of war or open hostility. It is an active and sincere pursuit of justice. It is a commitment to recognizing the dignity of every person and to removing all forms of violence, prejudice, and exploitation. Without justice, true peace cannot exist.

We can learn from a recent statement by Archbishop Bernard Hebda of Minneapolis following the killings of Jeffrey Pettry and Renee Good by Immigration and Customs Enforcement officials. He wrote:

“The loss of another life amidst the tensions that have gripped Minnesota should prompt all of us to ask what we can do to restore the Lord’s peace. While we rightly thirst for God’s justice and hunger for his peace, this will not be achieved until we are able to rid our hearts of the hatreds and prejudices that prevent us from seeing each other as brothers and sisters created

in the image and likeness of God. That is as true for our undocumented neighbors as it is for our elected officials and for the people who have the unenviable responsibility of enforcing our laws. They all need our humble prayers.”

Rather than shouting past one another or allowing anger to turn into harm, we must urge our leaders to do the demanding work of meaningful immigration reform. Along with prayer and cooperation, this is one way we can begin to overcome the anger, political rhetoric, misinformation, and divisive forces that threaten the fabric of our nation—established nearly 250 years ago.


As Archbishop Hebda also observed, “Each year of inaction has made the debate louder, angrier, and less humane.”

As we reflect on the Beatitudes, may we strive to be people of peace. The Beatitudes are more than ethical guidelines; they are a way of life. They call us to care deeply about the world we inhabit and to help shape it into a place of truth, love, compassion, justice, freedom, and peace. This is what the Kingdom of God is all about.

The question for each of us is simple—and challenging: Am I ready for it?

WE WELCOME VERY REV. JAMES A. KUROLY

We warmly welcome Fr. James Kuroly as part of the celebration of the 100th Anniversary of Our Lady of Lourdes.



Fr. Kuroly has generously assisted our parish by celebrating Sunday and weekday Masses under the leadership of Fr. Duffy and myself. He was born in Queens, New York, and is from the parish of Saint Anthony of Padua. He attended Cathedral Preparatory Seminary High School in Elmhurst, New York, and later earned a degree in Philosophy from St. John’s University, while continuing his discernment at the Cathedral House of Formation in Douglaston.

Following his graduation, Fr. Kuroly entered the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington. He was ordained a priest in 2007 and assigned to Our Lady of Sorrows in Corona. From 2010 to 2016, he served as a faculty member and Assistant Principal at Cathedral Prep.

During this time, he also served as Spiritual Director of the Jornada Movement and as Chaplain for the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. He was later appointed Pastor of Saint Rose of Lima in Rockaway, where he served for three years.

In 2019, Bishop DiMarzio assigned Fr. Kuroly back to Cathedral Prep as Rector-President. Most recently, in 2022, Bishop Brennan appointed him Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, while he continued his role as Rector-President. He has also just been named Chair of the Diocese of Brooklyn's 175th Anniversary Celebration.

Fr. Kuroly holds an M.A. in Theology, an M.S. in Education, and an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES FEAST DAY TRIDUUM FEBRUARY 8-11





Reflection for Next Sunday Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 8, 2026

First Reading: 58:7-10

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Gospel Reading: Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus teaches that his disciples are to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

Family Connection

Following upon the teaching of the Beatitudes, Jesus uses the now familiar metaphors of salt and light to describe the life of discipleship. We take salt and light for granted in our society, but these commodities were more precious in ancient cultures. Just as now, salt was used in Jesus' time for flavoring, as a preservative, and as a healing agent. Similarly, the widespread use of electricity in the modern world makes us less aware of the value and importance of light in our lives.

Still, our familiarity with this passage from Matthew's Gospel speaks well to the abiding power of the imagery that Jesus presented. Jesus' call to be salt for the earth and light for the world powerfully states our mission as Church and as Christians. Our commitment to social justice flows from the exhortation that Jesus gives us in today's Gospel. Some of the activities that this commitment leads us to are given more concrete expression as the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. When we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, console those who mourn, and so on, we show ourselves to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. When we do these things with the community of faith, the Church, we are indeed acting as "a city set on a mountain" that cannot be hidden!




