## THE GUIDING LIGHT FROM THE GROTTO Sixth SUNDAY OF EASTER JOHN 14:15-21

#### THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

A few months ago, I wrote to you about the National Eucharistic Revival that the Catholic Church in the United States is undertaking from 2022 to 2024. This is to help each of us renew our belief and faith that the bread and wine that is consecrated at Mass is the true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. We call this the Real Presence.

In honor of the Real Presence & the National Eucharistic Revival we are extending our traditional Eucharistic Procession for Corpus Christi.

This year on Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup>, we will join with the parish of St. Thomas the Apostle, West Hempstead in carrying the Blessed Sacrament from our Church to their Chapel located on Hempstead Ave. The Eucharistic Procession will take place following the 12 Noon Mass. This will be a great bi-parish event. Please join us!

During this time of the National Eucharistic Revival I will insert articles from different resources to help us to better understand the Eucharist, the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration and what it means for us as Catholics and as human beings.

Here are some catechetical questions about the Eucharist from the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops to help us reflect deeper on the Eucharist.

#### What is the Eucharist?

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word *Eucharistic*, meaning thanksgiving.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present --body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. -USCCB

#### Where is the Eucharist mentioned in the Bible?

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church a memorial of his death and resurrection. The Institution of the Eucharist is written down in the four Gospels below:

Matthew 26:26-30

Mark 14:22-26

Luke 22:14-20

John 6:22-59 (The Bread of Life Discourse)

#### Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the

humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life.

#### Is the Eucharist a Symbol?

The transformed bread and wine are truly the Body and Blood of Christ and are not merely symbols. When Christ said "This is my body" and "This is my blood," the bread and wine are transubstantiated. Though the bread and wine appear the same to our human faculties, they are actually the real body and blood of Jesus.

#### The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the preparation of the gifts and the altar. As the ministers prepare the altar, representatives of the people bring forward the bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of Christ. The celebrant blesses and praises God for these gifts and places them on the altar, the place of the Eucharistic sacrifice. In addition to the bread and wine, monetary gifts for the support of the Church and the care of the poor may be brought forward. The Prayer over the Offerings concludes this preparation and disposes all for the Eucharistic Prayer.

#### The Eucharistic Prayer

The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this prayer, the celebrant acts in the person of Christ as head of his body, the Church. He gathers not only the bread and the wine, but the substance of our lives and joins them to Christ's perfect sacrifice, offering them to the Father.

The introductory dialogue establishes that this prayer is the prayer of the baptized and ordained, is offered in the presence of God, and has thanksgiving as its central focus. Following this dialogue, the celebrant begins the Preface, which consists of four different Eucharistic Prayers. After these prayers, communion is then given.

#### **Reflection for Next Sunday Seventh Sunday of Easter** May 21, 2023

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8,14-17 Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:15-18 Gospel Reading: John 14:15-21

Jesus promises his disciples that he will send them another advocate, the Spirit of truth.

#### **Family Connection**

The mystery of the Trinity can be difficult for us to grasp. Today's Gospel invites us to consider how the three persons— Father, Son, and Holy Spirit- work together so that God's salvation is made known to us. Jesus' mission is continued through the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of his disciples. We have received this same Spirit through our Baptisms. The Spirit, living and working within us, reveals the mystery of God's love for us. Just as the first disciples were not left orphaned, we are not orphaned; we remain in God's embrace through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Gather your family and invite each family member to say what he or she knows about the Holy Spirit. Read aloud today's Gospel, John 14:15-21. What does Jesus say the Holy Spirit will do for the disciples? Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we come to share in the love of God made known to us in Jesus. Pray together, thanking God for this gift of the Holy Spirit by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.




